

Statements required in notice if the proposed tax rate exceeds the no-new-revenue tax rate but does not exceed the voter-approval tax rate, as prescribed by Tax Code §§26.06(b-2).

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

This notice only applies to a taxing unit other than a special taxing unit or municipality with a population of less than 30,000, regardless of whether it is a special taxing unit.

PROPOSED TAX RATE: \$0.099400 per \$100

NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE: \$0.093449 per \$100

VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE: \$0.099400 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2024 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Williamson Emergency Services District #5 from the same properties in both the 2023 tax year and the 2024 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Williamson Emergency Services District #5 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Williamson Emergency Services District #5 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2024 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON 08/19/2024 05:00 PM (CT) at Williamson County ESD #5, Station 2, 155 CR 313, Jarrell, TX

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Williamson Emergency Services District #5 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Williamson County Emergency Services District #5 of Williamson Emergency Services District #5 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.
